Life Members, Lupe and Mark Weiss (1994) are mainstay volunteers at both the Mainstation and Outstation. They spent years working to make sure kids and grandkids have as much fun as the adults, helping with and hosting Easter and Christmas Parties.

Lupe said her kids were in grade school and middle school when she took over the kids Easter party from a member ready to pass the egg. "The Easter parties have always been a big thing and the Christmas parties, because of the grandkids and now it's not just grandkids but members with kids young enough to participate," Lupe said.

She and Mark have also spent many years cooking, decorating and helping out during the 4th of July and other summer holiday weekends at the Outstation. Mark served

on many committees; 5 years on the Board of Trustees (2 as chair), 12 years on Planning and Finance (currently the chair), Electrical, 520 Liaison and the rebuild of Dock Three.

On the Electrical committee during the 2000s, he said they not only created a plan for the Mainstation, but they also devised a way to pay off the \$1.3 million needed for it, in 7 years.

So how did he get involved in all of these committees? "Someone asked me to be on the board and once I got involved it became obvious that some of the skill sets I have from my job and experience, is very helpful to the Club," Mark answered.

Mark said he works capital projects that are way larger than Club business, so it's easy for him to help out and get it done, with the Club's projects on a much smaller scale. The events and projects that Lupe takes on may top Mark on the 'flair factor!'

In addition to the kids' parties, she used to run Entertainment Night and often takes on the decorated boat project for Opening Day. "It is a lot of behind the scenes, of playing off the Opening Day

theme and then ordering the banner, what kind of costumes are we going to wear? There's a lot but once it all comes together it's fun," she said.

Lupe said she helps wherever she can and that the 'ask' for help works. "I think if you ask them they'll do it. Otherwise, they just stand on the side and watch," Lupe said.

"New Bowhaus" was the first boat back to the newly rebuilt Dock Three and we're delighted to be back at the Club. Waterfront Construction completed the project on time and the dock is greatly improved. The dock now has open grid decking on the main walkways, new power pedestals with increased outlet availability, new water faucets and new pilings that make for a more stable structure. These enhancements modernize our moorage facility. Due to the 520 construction project, you'll notice that the work slips have been moved to the outer south end of Dock Three. They may be moved again to make room for visiting boats from other Clubs during Opening Week. Mark Weiss and Tom

Johnson have been the primary contacts who are working with Skanska on the logistics and communications needed to move this project along. They have been working on this not just for the last few months, but the last several years. We will have to deal with the impact of the 520 project through 2031, so be prepared to work with future Bridge Officers who will encounter further challenges that inevitably occur with a project as complex as this. Past Commodore Scott Grimm and Commodore Doug Genord have been working the space assignments and dock capacity and will fit some 30 visiting boats into our marina to enjoy the Opening Day activities, from the Windermere Crew Races to the Boat Parade. While mooring at Elliott Bay Marina over the last four months, Margi and I enjoyed ourselves at this great facility,





engaged in the sport of predicted log racing in 1920. Participants can get started with minimum preparation time and effort and enjoy the challenge of the rally without having to master as much. Skull sessions to teach newbies have been replaced with

zoom sessions or on-the-boat experience.

Unlike car rallies, boat navigation rallies focus on providing an easy and enjoyable way to learn to use and practice using all the electronic 'toys' we have today. But like car rallies, these contests are social events designed for the whole family. The adage that 'log racing is a social event' is still true. All rallies are like most boating event weekends or club cruises with lots of social activities.

Any boating activity that has the benefit of family participation and the need to know your boat is important. Fuel costs could have some effect, but if you are using your boat, you are using fuel. Rallies are only 10-15 nautical miles, so fuel is not a major expense. In other words, he questions, why not try it? 🚢



Folks claim that a bald eagle usually flies over the Opening Day parade. The bald eagle represents many things, indigenous only to North America. Seattleites consider Opening Day their own special tradition which occurs each year in the first

week of May. Spectators stroll or picnic along the Montlake Cut admiring the colorful vessels that include rowboats, pleasure boats, tugboats and U.S. Coast Guard cutters. The University of Washington's Husky Band and cheerleaders usually join in the fun. The Seattle Yacht Club's Opening Day Parade has occurred since May 1, 1920. The present structure of Opening Day was

initiated in the early 1950s. Other yacht clubs in the Puget Sound were invited to participate in the parade and compete for trophies. SYC's Opening Day theme was adopted in 1959, and since then, participants have decorated their boats around a specific theme. In 1976, log booms were placed on both sides of the parade course and skippers started tying their boats to the log booms for prime parade activities and viewing.

Queen City's Opening Day festivities run from Wednesday through Sunday. It is time for Queen City members to gather, enjoy friendships and make new ones. There is food throughout, beverages, wine tasting, music/dancing and socializing among QC members as well as members of visiting yacht clubs. This year's theme "Back to the 80s", members may come as they are or dress for the occasion.

The Ships Stores in the Mainstation is open where QCYC attire may be obtained. QC and SYC are neighbors, shuttle boats run between the two clubs Thurs and the

The Hidden Risk in Marinas: Overload Current Damaging Shore Power Cables

In the tranquil world of marinas, where boats sway gently under the sun, a silent but potent threat lingers beneath the surface: overload currents. These electrical surges, often caused by boats pulling excessive power from shore, pose a significant risk to the shore power cables and the infrastructures that support them.

Shore power cables are a lifeline for boats at marinas, providing electricity for everything from appliances to essential systems onboard. However, when the demand for electricity exceeds the cable's capacity, the cables are subjected to stress that can lead to overheating, damage, or even complete failure.
